

CRE Statutory Guidelines

Current Research in Egyptology is an annual English language conference inviting papers on any subject relating to Egyptology, with no theme.

The aim of CRE is to provide a platform for postgraduate students, early career researchers and independent scholars to present their research, and priority should be given to these people over those with an established career in the field.

An AGM will take place at each conference. All registered attendees who are present at the meeting may vote on issues raised at the AGM.

Prospective hosts must bid for the next conference at the AGM, with the outcome to be decided by a vote. In the event that there are no successful bids (or no bids are placed) the permanent committee will decide a course of action.

The conference (funding, organisation, and acceptance of papers) is entirely the responsibility of the organising committee.

It is the responsibility of the organising committee to edit and publish the CRE proceedings. In the event they cannot, it is their responsibility to find an alternative.

A permanent committee of four people will provide support to the current committee when needed. Each member of the permanent committee may serve for a total of 2 years, and must be elected to the committee at the AGM. The permanent committee may not change the guidelines of the conference without the permission of the AGM.

The official logo of CRE may not be changed except for the colour.

CRE website will be paid for each year by the hosting conference committee.

Any profits (as in money left over) from a CRE conference will go to the CRE organising committee of the conference taking place two years later, starting from CRE 2015.

Years will be used instead of roman numerals for CRE conferences, starting from CRE 2017.
