Organising Committee:

Omaima El-Shal (Conference's President)

Omaima El-Shal is a professor of Egyptology (history, monuments, art, and literature). She got her MA and PhD from the University of Lille III, France. Now she is acting as the dean of the archaeology and tourism Guidance faculty, Misr University for Science and Technology (MUST). She is also working as a scientific collaborator at the French Institute for Oriental Archaeology, IFAO. She has been the head of the mission at Tabbet el-Gueish el-Sharqueyah at Saqqara (Egypt) since 2021 (MUST). She has participated in different Archaeological missions in Deir el-Medineh (Egypt), Kom el-Hitan (Egypt), Tell el-Herr (Egypt), Douai (France).

Khaled Hassan (Conference's Vice-President)

Khaled Hassan is an associate professor of Egyptology at Misr University for Science and Technology, specializing in hieratic texts (ostraca, papyri, and wooden tablets). He earned his Ph.D. from Cairo University and completed DAAD-funded postdocs at Johannes Gutenberg University, Mainz. He has held research positions at IFAO (2017–2020) and ARCE (2022). Marwa Soliman is an Egyptologist and assistant professor at Mansoura University, as well as Misr University for Science and Technology, specializing in ancient Egypt and the Near East. Her research spans political conflicts, Libyan influences on Egypt, and buffer zones in the New Kingdom. She also fosters academic collaboration as a coordinator between Mansoura and Hazarah University, Pakistan. Marwa also contributes to journals like "Pakistan Heritage" and serves on the editorial board of the Journal of Asian Civilizations.

Dr. Fatma Mohamed Amin Fowzy

Lecturer, Tourism Guidance Department, specializing in 19th and 20th-century Egyptian history, Dr. Fatma Fowzy explores the cultural, political, and social

transformations that shaped modern Egypt. Her research focuses on visual heritage, archival studies, and the intersection of tourism with historical memory. Through her academic work, she seeks to enrich the understanding of Egypt's modern legacy and its representation in historical narratives. A dedicated educator, she combines scholarly rigor with a passion for guiding students in interpreting Egypt's complex historical landscape.

Assistant Lecturer, Department of Islamic Archaeology – Egypt University for Science and Technology, Sherif is an academic and archaeologist specializing in Islamic architecture. Actively engaged in academia, he has participated in organizing international and local conferences. For 20-minutes and 10-minutess presentations will be followed by a 5-minutes discussion, before a 5-minute break to allow participants to move between the different rooms. There will be three parallel sessions taking place, and each session will feature either three or four talks

<u>Presented posters</u> must be printed in the A0 format (118.9 x 84.1 cm) and with a vertical orientation only. Additional design choices are left at the discretion of



the presenters, but the poster must contain the name, affiliate institution, and contact details of the author(s). If desired, the organisers can print posters at the MUST


